In spring 2023, I embarked on an exciting new series, albeit with humble beginnings: I was having a Richmond mover-and-shaker to dinner and wanted something new for a wall near the dining room. Three shadowboxes found on sale hinted that 3D was the way to go. The dinner was a day away (read the details on my Facebook page). In a nutshell: The Paper Series was born, and the dinner party was a success.


The technique used in the first works in the *Paper Series* involved constructing intricate low-relief structures by folding, twisting, weaving, and layering cut pieces of paper. Compositions were assembled and glued, and many of the forms were wetted before shaping. When dry, the rigid or semi-rigid substrates serve as both background and subject matter to which paint is applied. Subtly-toned sculptural forms hint at metal, wood, plastic, or other materials. The final pieces in this series of initial paper works ventured into full 3D sculpture in the round.

Limited color throughout the series enhances the depth of the forms and the dimensionality of the shapes and planes, imparting a sense of drama in some compositions and etherealness in others. Each piece invited seemingly limitless exploration of light, shadow, and texture.

Assembly was at times daunting, particularly during the process of building larger pieces such as <u>Babylon</u> and <u>Rook</u>. In <u>Babylon</u> (which is a study and is not promised to be archival) there is structural makeshift work, but it reveals clear indication of the active search for solutions during the process and a record of the obstacles encountered.

The collection has been a heavy workout for my conceptualization skills in an effort to find my way through a new approach to creating art. This series has laid the foundation for further exploration in 3D work. And that's inspiring.



Watercolor paper assembled with glue and wetted, shaped, and embellished with oil pigment, cold wax, flourescent glaze, gold leaf, graphite powder, and an inkjet print of a manipulated conversation bubble from iMessages; the whole then satin-varnished, trimmed, pierced with quilting pins, and set inside a white shadowbox / Signature-embossed *recto* and *verso*, additional signature inside shadowbox / Approximately 9.125 x 8 inches, with variable depth, independent of framing / 11 x 11 x 2.5 inches framed



DUANE CREGGER is an artist working in oils and mixed media. His paintings are visual dialogues of past events and potential futures, visually defined by color, texture, and mark-making. Multiple surface layers suggest an accumulation of subconscious ideas and experiences that beg expression toward a goal of resolving conflict within the psyche. Ultimately, the work is an invitation to contemplate the human experience.

Cregger has a degree in art communications from Roanoke College in Salem, Virginia, and a decades-long award-winning career in design and creative direction. He has been recognized for excellence in various exhibitions, including the juried biennials at Roanoke College's Olin Hall Galleries and William King Museum. His work is in corporate collections in the mid-Atlantic, in private collections across the United States (including that of actress/director Drew Barrymore), and in Canada and the Caribbean. A triptych from his *Crown: New Work 2022* series was acquired by a philanthropist for the Roanoke College Permanent Collection.

Cregger's paintings have been featured in Élan Magazine, American Art Collector, Cottage Style by Better Homes & Gardens, Home & Design, Richmond Home, Traditional Home, and the Better Homes & Gardens Home Decorating Guide. Most recently his work was seen in the Hulu special series, Dopesick, directed by and starring Michael Keaton.

Cregger lives in Richmond, Virginia, with his husband and their two Daisy Dogs and maintains a studio space, open by appointment, at Crossroads Art Center.
